Alex Vatanka is a senior analyst at the Middle East Institute (MEI) in Washington D.C. He joined MEI in 2007.

He specializes in Middle Eastern political and security affairs with a particular focus on Iran. From 2006 to 2010, he was the Managing Editor of *Jane's Islamic Affairs Analyst*. From 2001 to 2006, he was an analyst at Jane's in London (UK) where he mainly covered the Middle East. Alex is also a Senior Fellow in Middle East Studies at the US Air Force Special Operations School (USAFSOS) at Hurlburt Field and teaches as an Adjunct Professor at DISAM at Wright-Patterson AFB.

He has lectured widely for both governmental and commercial audiences, including the US Department State, US military services, US Congressional staff, and Middle Eastern energy firms.

Beyond Jane's and the Middle East Institute, he has written for such outlets as Christian Science Monitor, Foreign Affairs.com, Americas Quarterly, CNN.com, the Journal of International Security Affairs, BBC Persian Online, Jamestown Foundation, The World Today, PBS, Daily Beast, the Jerusalem Post and the Council of Foreign Relations.

Some of his most recent publications have included "Tangle in the Caucasus: Iran and Israel fight for influence in Azerbaijan"; "The Guardian of Pakistan's Shia"; "The Artesh: Iran's marginalized regular military;" and "The odd couple: Iran and Qatar and Arab Revolutions."

Born in Tehran, he holds a BA in Political Science (Sheffield University, UK), and an MA in International Relations (Essex University, UK), and is fluent in Farsi and Danish. He is currently working on a book on Iranian-Pakistani relations and its impact on US national security.
