

HISTORICAL OIL PRODUCTION INCREASES





GDP AND EMPLOYMENT IMPACT OF PRODUCTION SURGE V. STIMULUS














GLOBAL DEMAND GROWTH (IN QBTU)













INTERNATIONAL NATURAL GAS PRICES





BREAKEVEN PRICES: OIL REVENUE AS % OF BUDGET












- Improves but does not solve energy security issues

- Exacerbates EU competitiveness concerns
- Increases pressure on green agenda
- Does little to alleviate concerns with unpredictable suppliers in Russia and MENA Complicates intra-Asian dynamics
